17 Global Goals have been set and agreed upon by 193 world leaders. 17 Global Goals came into effect in 2016 and are on the basis of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The completion of these goals would mean an

### end to poverty, inequality, and climate change by 2030.

Placing these goals alone is not enough. We must each play our part in order to reach these goals. For this reason, NDU MUN is proud to present the following competitions:

# -louaize-MUN

You are to assume that you are located in the **United Nations Headquarters**, New York, at the **General Assembly**, as an ambassador, discussing this Topic on the Agenda: *"Technology and the Future of Sustainable Development"*.

There are **two** speech options:

- A. You are to make a <u>one minute</u> speech on how you believe the technology of today may help us reach the Global Goals, or hinder us from doing so.
- B. You are to make a <u>one minute</u> speech adding one more goal to the 17 existing ones, and explaining why this goal must be introduced, within the parameters of Sustainability.

#### How to Participate:

Interested delegates are required to upload the video on their Instagram page giving one of the speeches in a *very creative setting of their choice*.

In order to be eligible for entry, delegates must:

- 1. Follow the NDU MUN Page on Instagram (@ndu.mun)
- 2. Make sure to remove their profile privacy (so we can see the video!)
- 3. Upload the speech video
- 4. Use the hashtags: #NDUMUN #youthforSDGs #2ndNDUMUNConference
- 5. Tag our page
- 6. Get as much likes on your video as possible by asking friends and family

 \*\*The posts with the most likes will gain an advantage with regards to the final decision
\*\*For likes to be counted the accounts following the NDU MUN page are the only ones counted.

During the Closing Ceremony on Sunday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of April, the winning delegate's speech will be announced and the delegate will be asked to give the speech in front of all attendees, before claiming their prize.

The deadline for submission is April 20, 2018.

This competition is about producing a drawing, painting, photographic shot, or a collage of images showing how one or more of the Sustainable Development Goals **are/ are not** being reached.

The competition helps delegates recreate how they see the world, and helps them to understand that sustainability can be found in its simplest forms.

The submission is to be designed on an A2 size sheet: 42cm-59.4cm and can be made either digitally or by hand.

Hard copies of all submissions will be hung at NDU during the final conference days.

Soft copies are to be sent as RGB, JPG, Resolution 150, and size proportional to 2500 pixels (Largest side).

The deadline for online submission is April 20, 2018.

**Note**: In case delegates wish to use a computer based program for their design, such as Photoshop, we would like to request the .psd file to be submitted alongside their design sheet by email.
