# **GUIDELINES FOR A SUCCESSFUL POSTER PRESENTATION**

A poster presentation conveys your ideas visually, through a selective assemblage of illustrations (such as graphs, tables, and photographs) that are carefully integrated with a <u>small amount of text</u>. All these materials are fastened to a poster or display board.

Poster size: A0

The following advice may help you get started.

### I. USE A SIMPLE AND LOGICAL ORGANIZATION

**Step 1:** Start with a specific (and compelling) title.

**Step 2:** The design should invite the reader to start at one place and proceed logically according to a particular sequence.

#### **II.** FOCUS ON THE MAIN POINTS

**Hint 1:** Keep text (typed) to a minimum. Text should be easily readable from at least one meter away.

**Hint 2:** A poster should be highly visual with an attractive, uncluttered appearance. Use photographs or other types of illustrations to make your poster attractive and clear.

**Hint 3:** Use graphs and tables to highlight only the major points, trends, or relationships.

**Hint 4:** Consider using lists of numbered points, rather than paragraphs of text, to summarize results or conclusions.

### PS: Remember both the advantages and the constraints of a visual format.

### **III.P**REPARE IN ADVANCE FOR QUESTIONS & INFORMAL DISCUSSION

**Point 1:** Anticipate some of the questions you may be asked, and prepare for them by writing out notes or composing brief replies.

**Point 2:** You may learn a great deal from thoughtful readers of your poster.

Rule 1: 2 students are allowed to work as a group.

**Rule 2:** The group members should state their names, major, faculty, class section, & date.

Rule 3: Exact copying of information is not allowed by any means.

Rule 4: Indicate clearly the source of the information used and include the references

Rule 5: The list of references (minimum of 3) should be stated.

# **IV. CRITERIA FOR EVALUATING POSTER PRESENTATION:**

- Content (relevance, organization, clarity)
- References
