Ms. Sabbar met with Dr. Guita Hourani, Assistant Professor at the Notre Dame University-Louaize (NDU) Faculty of Law and Political Science (FLPS) and Director of the Lebanese Emigration Research Center (LERC) at NDU to discuss the topic of her thesis. Ms. Sabbar's research topic is related to the market labor in Lebanon, examined from a critical neo-liberal point of view, especially as it pertains to the role and influence of migrant domestic workers on it, their rights (or lack of them), their social mobilizations and the institutions and organizations that support them, as well as the legal and political framework that defines their condition.

Ms. Sabbar was born in Casablanca, later she migrated with her family to Italy. She is an International Sciences student at the University of Turin. She has also studied International Politics in Sciences Po Bordeaux in France as part of the joint degree program Turin-Bordeaux. In 2014 she graduated from the University of Turin in "International relations, development and cooperation" with a thesis on the political transformations in Morocco in the aftermath of the "Arab Spring". She has been active with Italian and Moroccan organizations of civil society, such as Giovani Democratici and AMDH-Association Marocaine pour les droits des hommes.
